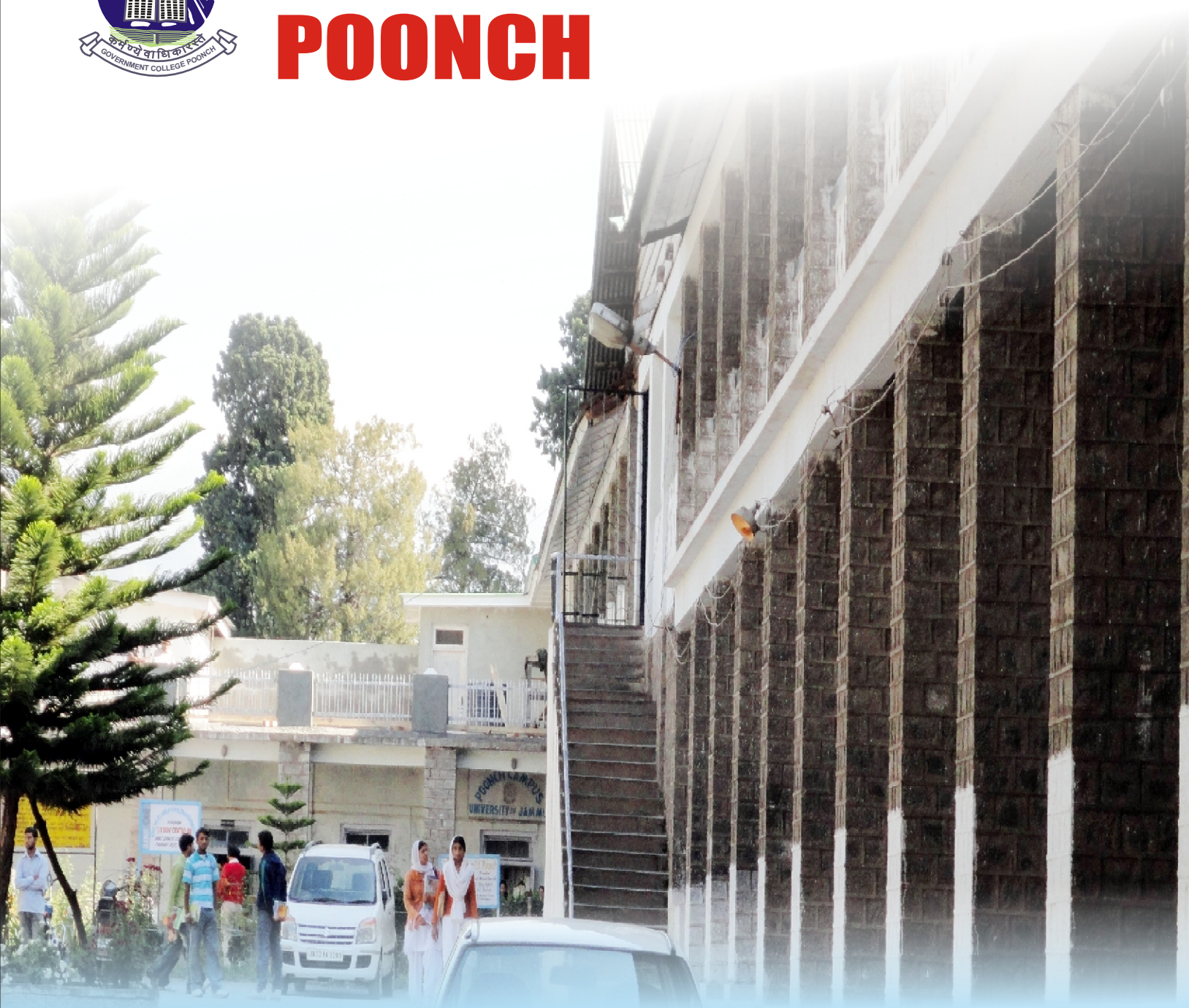

The College A Profile

Government Degree College, Poonch was established on 11th November 1955. Initially it started functioning as an Intermediate College in the old “Resham Ghar” building in 'Mohalla Dungas'. Prof. R.L. Basur, an eminent educationist of our state was its first Principal. In 1961, it was elevated to the status of a Degree College and Prof. P.N. Pushup, another great educationist and scholar, headed this institution during its developmental phase. In early sixties, the College was shifted to its present location, the upper portion of which was a part of 'Favara Garden' and the lower part across the main road was covered with barracks and bunkers vacated by Army, who shifted to 'Resham Ghar'site. The College theory classes used to be held in bunkers and barracks while the science practical work was conducted in temporary laboratories set up in the old portion of the “Dak Banglow” Poonch. The Science laboratories were later shifted to present Science block after its construction in 1969-70. Unfortunately, a good chunk of the College land was given for construction of Gujjar and Bakarwal Hostel, ITI campus and Horticulture Nursery etc. and the College retained only the present campus and playground. Giving away the land of college has closed all the doors for its future expansion and development. It is for this reason the various building blocks were constructed in a limited space, adjoining the thickly populated locality “Mohalla Panditan”. The College administration, has tried its best to give some face lift to it by raising boundary wall and stream-lining the available space into lawns.

The College was earlier affiliated to Jammu and Kashmir University, which was later converted into two separate Universities, The University of Jammu and The University of Kashmir. The College is presently affiliated to the University of Jammu and is recognized by University Grants Commission (UGC) under section 2(f) & 12(B).

The College celebrated its golden Jubilees in the year 2005. It was also badly affected in the devastating earthquake of October 2005. A lot of repair and renovation work has been accomplished and the college is ready to receive the new entrants. The College offers undergraduate courses in Arts, Sciences, Commerce, and Vocational courses in Sericulture and B.C.A. as a professional course besides Add-on-Course in Functional English, Sericulture and certificate courses in some subjects. The infrastructure of the College is constantly upgraded to enable it to cater to the growing needs of the students with newly introduced subjects. The college has a well-equipped Multipurpose Hall with modern infrastructures. It has been fully renovated and made functional in the year, 2016. We are sure that the products of this College shall be fully equipped to meet the challenges in the new millennium.

Location of the College

Govt. Degree College Poonch, situated in the heart of Poonch Town is surrounded by Krishan Chander Park to its East, General Bus Stand to its West, small hillocks to its North and College ground to its South. The college campus is well maintained and presents a serene view with well maintained lawns and flower beds.

1. Eligibility Criteria for Admission to B.A/B.Sc./B.Com. Semester-I (CBCS)

Admission to Semester 1st of the three year B.A/B.Sc./B.Com. (General) Course shall be open to a candidate having passed the Higher Secondary Part-II (10+2 pattern) examination (in full subjects) of the Jammu & Kashmir State Board of School Education or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto subject to availability of seats & if otherwise found eligible.

2. Eligibility Criteria For Admission To B.C.A Course Semester-1

Admission to Semester-First of the three year B.C.A Course shall be open to a candidate having passed the Higher Secondary Part-II (10+2 pattern) examination (in full subjects) of the Jammu & Kashmir State Board of School Education or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto with Mathematics as one of the elective subjects and has obtained at least 50% of the aggregate marks in the qualifying examination in case of General category candidates and 45% marks in case of SC/St candidates.

Add-On Courses

3. Functional English

Aims and Objectives:

The Department of English runs an Add-on-Course in Functional English for enrolled students of the college for various courses. The aims and objectives of this course are to develop the communicative skills in listening, speaking, reading and writing. The focus of the course is on how English is used in real life situations, through the items listed in the syllabus. The learners are expected to develop fluency in conversation and efficiency in interactional skills. They are also expected to learn English Grammar communicatively so that they become effective and efficient communicators in the English language.

The course is affiliated to the University of Jammu. A well-equipped Language Laboratory and Seminar Library has been established in the Department of English keeping in view the future demands of the learners.

Admission Process

a) Eligibility for Admission

The admission of students to the B.A/B.Sc/B.Com/BCA 1st semester is open to students who have passed the Higher Secondary Part II exam (10+2) of J & K State Board of School Education or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto. The admission is given strictly on merit basis in accordance with college intake capacity for different streams/subject combinations fixed by Higher Education Department/University of Jammu. Whereas, admission to B.Sc. Semester-I has been restricted to students who obtain 45% or above marks at Higher Secondary Part II / 12th class level or its equivalent but in case of candidates belonging to categories (as per S.R.O.126 of J&K Govt. Dated 28/06/1994), the percentage for admission is reduced to 40%.

- No student with Arts background in Hr. Sec-Part II class shall be permitted in Science Stream. However, a student with science background may be allowed to join Arts Stream subject to availability of seats.
- The student shall be admitted for the subject combinations strictly permitted by the University of Jammu and subject to their feasibility in the college vis-a-vis availability of infrastructure, teaching faculty members and intake capacity.
- Admission to Semester III & V shall be made on the basis of criteria as notified by Jammu University.

b) Certificates to be submitted:

A student seeking admission should present himself/herself personally along with the parent/guardian to the college and shall present the following documents.

1. Marks certificate in original of the qualifying examinations (along with two attested copies)
2. (a) Provisional/Character certificates in original from the Head of the Institution last attended in case of regular students.
(b) Provisional / Character certificates from J&K State Board of School Education and character certificate from DSP/SHO (Police) of that area in the case of private candidates.
3. Date of birth certificate-Secondary School certificate issued by J&K State Board of School Education.
4. Four copies of the passport size photographs.
5. Category certificate, income certificate from the competent Authority (only for those who want to apply for scholarship/financial assistance).
6. However, the students who have passed their qualifying examination from the Institution other than the J&K State Board of School Education shall have to submit the following Documents in addition to the above.
 - a. Migration certificate in original from the University/Board from which the student has passed the qualifying examination.
 - b. Eligibility certificate from the University of Jammu.
 - c. No objection certificate from the college Principal of his home district in J&K, if the candidate belongs to a district other than Poonch.

CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION:

1. If student after having been admitted remains continuously absent for 10 days without any genuine grounds, his/her name shall be struck off from the college rolls and he/she will not be re-admitted during the same session.
2. Any student found indulging in any undesirable activity in the college shall be dealt with under rules even to the extent of rustication from the college.
3. Any students indulging in ragging.

INTERNAL ASSESSMENT:**1. Internal Assessment for SIX Semesters Degree Course:****(a) Break up of Marks of Semesters System CBCS/Non CBCS:**

Internal Assessment shall carry 20% weight-age and end semester Examination 80% Weight-age. The distribution of Internal Assessment marks shall be as follows:

External Evaluation:

80% of the total marks in theory and 50% of the total marks in practical are reserved for external evaluation. A student is permitted to take the university examination subject to the fulfillment of the following eligibility requirements.

- a) The student pays the university examination fee at the time of submission of the examination form.
- b) A student cannot be allowed to appear in the university examination unless he/she has attended 75% of the total lectures delivered during the session in each theory subject and a minimum no. of required Practicals/Session in each Science subject.
- c) Not more than 30 duties in all shall be given to a student who has participated in sports/NCC/NSS or any other extra-curricular activities of the college during the entire academic session.

Certificates:

An outgoing student may obtain the following certificates from the College:-

- i. Provisional cum Transfer Certificate.
- ii. Character Certificate.
- iii. College leaving certificate (If a student leaves in midsession)
- iv. Certificate of having appeared in the University Examination.

College Library:

The College library at present has a collection of about 32000 books in Govt. Grant Section and Special Assistance Plan. There is a reading room attached to the College Library. About 20 magazines, newspapers and journals etc. are being subscribed for enhancing the general knowledge of the students.

With the help of University Grants Commission, a Text Book section (Book Bank) has been opened where a large number of textbooks are available for the needy and deserving students. Books out of this section are issued for the entire session to the meritorious but poor students who cannot afford to purchase books.

Library Rules:

01. The Library presently observes the same working hours and holidays as the College. It remains open for the students during the summer vacation from 8 a.m. to 2.00 p.m. unless notified otherwise.
02. Every student at the time of borrowing books from the library shall present to the librarian his/her Identity Card. A person borrowing books from the library shall be held responsible for any loss of pages or damage of the book and he/she will have to pay fine in addition to double the cost of that book.
03. As per the new guidelines permitted by Govt. Circular No. HE/GEN/696/10 dated 01-01-2011, teachers are not allowed to borrow more than 05 books at a time. No member of the College staff may borrow books from the library on his own name for the use of the students.
04. Members of the College staff or the establishment at the time of leaving the College on transfer, retirement or otherwise are required to return all the books borrowed by them before the L. P. C. or "No Demand" certificate is issued in their favour.

05. Students can borrow only two books at a time, which include at least one book of the subject taken by him/her.
06. students must return books taken by them within fifteen days .Any student retaining a book after the time allowed shall have to pay a fine of Re 1/-per day per volume until the same is returned, provided the fine incurred shall not exceed double the cost of the book.
07. The Librarian shall keep a record of the book issued. In the beginning of every month or at the time of realization of dues by the Cashier, librarian shall submit to the office a list of fine imposed on students for late return of books. They shall have to deposit the fine with the College cashier within seven days of the submission of the list, failing which the student will not be allowed to attend the classes.
08. Books required by the College teachers, if borrowed by any other person, must be returned on the receipt of a notice issued from the librarian duly countersigned by the Principal.
09. The same person may borrow no book for the second time within two days from the date of its return by him/her. This rule, however, does not apply to the College teachers.
10. Any person, who has lost a book or torn, defaced and damaged it, shall be liable to pay an amount not less than double the cost of the book. When it belongs to a set or series, and unless he can replace it, he shall be liable to pay the cost of the whole set or series.
11. Students free from lecture work may visit the library during the College hours. No talking or disturbance of any kind is allowed in the library. Any infringement of this rule shall incur punishment/fine.
12. Library is meant only for the use of those persons who are directly or indirectly connected with the academic life of the College.
13. Books of the following description shall not be removed from the library except for a night that too only by the College teachers with special permission of the Principal in writing.
 - a) Books of reference
 - b) Current Periodicals
 - c) Sports and University Calendars
 - d) Books specially reserved(by order of Principal)
 - e) Rare books identified by College library Committee/Principal.
14. Periodicals shall not be issued except for consultation in the library premises.
15. All books shall have to be returned to the library every year at the time of stock checking, especially in April-May. The librarian shall make a report of books found damaged/missing to the Principal, soon after the stock checking is over. During the period of stock checking, no person except with the special permission of the Principal shall have the access to the library.
16. College teachers, who wish to retain certain books during the summer vacation, shall have to return the same to the library at the time of stock checking.
17. Sleeping, smoking and spitting etc. are strictly prohibited in the library.

General Rules:

1. No outsider is allowed to enter the College premises without a valid reason and without the permission of the Principal. He / She shall write his/her name, purpose of visit and the person he/she wishes to meet on the Visit Book available at the entry gate.
2. If a student remains absent from the college without permission for more than ten

- consecutive days, his/ her name shall be struck off from the College rolls.
3. Unlawful assembly of students in the College is banned.
 4. Writing of graffiti on the walls or sticking of posters is a cognizable offence.
 5. Ragging in any form, on or off the College Campus, including the hostels is a cognizable offence and the student(s) involved in ragging will be severely punished, even to the extent of being expelled from the College.
 6. Students resorting to violence in the campus or unfair mean in the examination are liable to be issued a bad Character Certificate in addition to the action initiated against them in accordance with the University rules & regulations.
 7. A student desirous of withdrawing his/ her name from the College rolls should submit an application duly countersigned by his/her parent/guardian. The withdrawal certificate shall be issued only after the student clears all College dues. Such students shall in no case be readmitted during the same academic session.
 8. Any student, who indulges in any indiscipline in the College, shall not be eligible for any Prize, Certificate, Award or Scholarship from the Institution. This shall apply to all the students including NCC Cadets, NSS Volunteers, players or the hostel boarders.
 9. The College authorities reserves the right to change, modify or suspend the rules as and when required.
 10. No student shall be allowed to enter in the college premises without proper UNIFORM.

Co-Curricular Activities:

NATIONAL CADETS CORPS (NCC)

To inculcate a sense of discipline, develop character, a desire for service and capacity for leadership, the College provides facilities for NCC training for the volunteer male & female students.

One NCC wing (Artillery/Infantry) is available in the College. The total number of seats is 90 (**60 for male and 30 for female students**) Prescribed NCC uniform kits are issued to the enrolled NCC cadets free of cost. Interested students may apply for admission to the concerned NCC Officer for further details. The admission shall be made on first come first serve basis.

Enrollment Rules and Regulations of NCC:

- a) NCC enrollment forms are available with NCC Officer of the College free of cost. The enrollment forms are also to be filled in at the time of the admission.
- b) Every enrolled NCC cadet has to undergo 40 parades of two hours each in the entire session.
- c) All cadets shall have to put in 75% attendance at parades so as to become eligible for certificate exams.
- d) Enrolled cadets have also to attend one camp.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

To instill a spirit of comradeship and love for humanity in general and community service of the village folk in particular, facilities are provided to willing students with a bit of social service to put in their best alleviating the suffering of the unfortunate brethren inhabiting in rural areas.

The NSS units work under the able guidance of trained NSS Programme Officers who guide them properly and chalk out programmes for the areas required to be served.

The College has two units of NSS each consisting of minimum 100 volunteers. The students have to apply on a prescribed form available free of cost from the College units. The enrollment forms are also to be filled in at the time of the admission.

Classification of NSS Programmes:

NSS activities have been classified into major two groups:-

- A) Regular NSS Activities:** Students undertake various activities in Adopted villages, College Campus and urban slums during weekend or after college hours.
- B) Special Camping Programme :** Camps of 10 days duration is organized in Adopted villages/urban slums during winter vacations with some specific project by involving local community. 50% enrollment of NSS volunteers is required to participate in this camp.

NSS Regular Activities:- The volunteer undertake various activities in adopted villages and urban slums for community services. They have to put in **120 hours** service such as:

- i) Orientation of NSS volunteers-20 hours** (Lecturers, discussions, field visits, audio Visuals).
- ii) Campus works./projects** involved in the project for the benefit of the Institution and the college students -**30 hours**.
- iii) Communities Service** in adopted villages/Urban slums -**70 hours**

A total of 120 hours of social services besides a special camping Programme of ten days duration in the academic session and Regular NSS Activities complete the minimum requirement of the Scheme.

Krishan Chander Memorial Career Counseling and placement Centre:

The College has a Centre for Career Counseling christened after the name of Krishan Chander a renowned literary luminary which previously was only providing information to admission seekers regarding subject Combinations and other admission related matters. From the previous sessions, this Cell shall also arranging extension lectures, different workshops with the co-ordination of different agencies providing information regarding employment opportunities. The students are made familiar with different job opportunities in different sectors like KAS, IAS, KPS, IFS, LIC, Banking, Army, Police, etc.

Remedial Coaching Cell:

The College has established a Remedial Coaching Cell funded by the UGC for ST,SC,OBC, Minorities and BPL Candidates. The students are given free coaching in all the subjects after the college hours.

Hostels:

The college has two separate hostels for the Boys and Girls students. Hostels accommodation is provided to the needy students who come from non-commutable far-off places within the district or outside. The College Hostels Committee/Warden makes the selection. The students interested to seek accommodation in the hostels shall have to apply on a plain paper indicating his/her academic bio-data accompanied by a certificate of his/her permanent residence issued by Tehsildar of that locality. The Committee for fair selection will interview the applicants
